Minutes of the 44th PPSMMA Annual General Meeting 2024/2025 held on Thursday, 11th September 2025 at 2:00PM

at G Hotel Gurney, Georgetown, Pulau Pinang & Zoom Meeting (Hybrid)

1. Welcome address by PPSMMA Chairman (2024/2025)

1.1 The outgoing PPS Chairman, Dato Dr. Parmjit Singh A/L Kuldip Singh opened the meeting by

expressing gratitude and humility as he reflected on his two consecutive terms of leadership. He

described it as an honour to serve, lead, and advocate alongside members, whom he regarded as

the backbone of the healthcare system. He highlighted that PPS had engaged in more than 100

meetings with stakeholders, ranging from the Prime Minister and Minister of Health to TPAs,

pharmaceutical companies, and other professional bodies. These engagements ensured that

members' concerns were consistently voiced at the highest levels.

1.2 He further emphasised landmark advocacy initiatives such as Black Monday and peaceful

assemblies, which symbolised the unity, courage, and determination of private doctors in

confronting unfair treatment. Acknowledging the long-standing frustrations surrounding the GP fee

schedule, which has remained unchanged for 34 years, he informed members that the matter had

been raised even at Cabinet level, though approval was not granted. Nonetheless, he assured

members that their concerns had been heard and reaffirmed his belief that the struggle would

continue under the new leadership.

1.3 The Chairman concluded his address with a call for unity, resilience, and hope, reminding members

that their efforts were not solely for themselves but for the future of private practice in Malaysia

and the patients who depend on them. He expressed appreciation to his Exco team—Dr Sri, Dr

Eratha, Dr Vani, Dr Eng Han, Dr Zamani, and co-opted member Dr Siva-for their dedication and

support. He ended with an inspiring quote that highlighted the physician's role as both healer and

compassionate advocate.

2. To confirm minutes from the previous PPSMMA Annual General Meeting

Following the Chairman's remarks, the minutes of the previous AGM, held in Sarawak, Kuching,

were presented for confirmation. As the minutes had been disseminated earlier, members were

invited to raise any queries. With no objections, the minutes were duly proposed, seconded, and

adopted. As there were no amendments, the minutes were then confirmed.

The previous minutes was accepted.

3. To adopt the Annual Report for the year preceding

- 3.1 The report was circulated to members via email prior to the AGM. Dato' Parmjit, the Chairman, presented a detailed account of PPS's numerous stakeholder engagements over the past year. Meetings were held with key organisations including PERKESO, AIA, KWSP, the Deputy Health Minister, the Secretary General of Health, the Malaysian Oncology Society, and the Minister of Health. Courtesy visits were also made to senior government officials, underscoring PPS's continued efforts to represent members at all levels of leadership.
- 3.2 The Chairman highlighted engagements with professional bodies such as the Malaysian Urological Association, which resulted in training opportunities for GPs in certain procedures following a dedicated webinar. PPS also sought clarity from the Malaysian Orthopaedic Association regarding intra-articular knee injections and received clearance for GPs to perform them. Discussions with OGSM led to a joint press release concerning sonographers, while dialogues with the Malaysian Society of Ophthalmology explored procedures that could safely be conducted in clinics..
- 3.3 In addition, PPS pursued advocacy on systemic issues. Engagements with CKAPS continued, though restrictions remained on certain GP practices. Meetings with CUEPACS and FOMCA addressed the challenges faced by GPs with TPAs, including administrative fees and consultation charges. While both organisations initially expressed support, they later issued negative press statements. PPS also raised concerns during the NACCOL meeting about the fee schedule, but the proposal was not accepted. The association further advocated on matters of medication price transparency, long-term drug pricing with MiCare, and highlighted unfair practices in the distribution of flu vaccines, where pharmacies were prioritised over primary care clinics.
- 3.4 Other notable engagements included discussions with ProtectHealth on the Madani Health Screening 2.0, meetings with Sanofi Aventis on vaccine supply, and multiple sessions with MOH officials, including the Director General of Health. The Chairman also reported a productive dialogue with the Pharmacy Department on prescription record-keeping, where the need for a joint meeting with CKAPS and Bahagian Amalan was advised. The series of advocacy efforts culminated with a courtesy visit to the Deputy Prime Minister, reaffirming PPS's commitment to advancing the interests of private practitioners.
- 3.4 Dr. Namazie, raised concern over AIA's recent removal of several specialists from its panel, noting that the decision was based on high overall hospital bills rather than doctors' professional fees,

which remain controlled. He explained that the affected specialists were those performing

advanced surgeries requiring specialised equipment, which naturally increased costs. Citing an

example of the only breast surgeon in his hospital who was excluded from the panel, he emphasised

that such actions were unfair and amounted to a disservice to patients by limiting access to

essential specialist care. He urged that the matter be formally brought up with AIA for review. In

response, Dato' Parmjit acknowledged that GPs were also facing similar issues with AIA and assured

that the matter would be brought up with the association, with the next team tasked to pursue it

further.

3.5 Datuk Dr. Gana Baskaran commended the Chairman and his team for their efforts in engaging with

stakeholders but raised concern over three key matters: the unresolved GP fee schedule, the

association's membership strength, and the low participation of members in public

demonstrations. He pointed out that although PPS has about 9,000 members, only around 700

doctors attended the recent "big walk," which he felt undermined the association's credibility.

He stressed that without strong visible support, PPS would struggle to gain recognition from

policymakers, especially when compared to other professional bodies like the Bar Council that have

demonstrated greater unity. He urged the leadership to focus on mobilising members more

effectively, highlighting that collective strength is essential to earn respect, influence decision-

makers, and safeguard the future of the profession.

3.6 Dato' Parmjit reported on the specialist section led by Dr. Gunalan, highlighting three key

initiatives. These included DRG engagements with parliamentarians, which successfully

strengthened understanding between policymakers and healthcare providers and reinforced the

importance of collaboration in maintaining a fair and sustainable healthcare system. He also noted

the continued discussions on the GP walk and the work of the grievance mechanism committee in

addressing members' concerns.

The Annual Report was accepted.
