On 27 January, I am excited about meeting our medical students from Penang for a brief chat regarding MMA and how we will prepare them throughout their career. I hope all states can organise a 'Meet MMA' event with their students and Housemen. They need to know that we are there for them.

I was invited to speak to Malaysian students at the UKEC conference at the University of Manchester on 25 February. I will have to debate with Tuan Khairy Jamalludin on the legalisation of

Cannabis in Malaysia. It will be an honour to share the stage with him.
