We had asked them to look at spending in the human resource capital to make sure we have enough doctors now and in the future for optimum healthcare delivery.

Meanwhile, on 10 February, I had the opportunity to meet students from Monash Medical University and Newcastle Medical University. We had presented to them about

bullying and harassment. I advised them to differentiate between bullying and teaching. We had a good dialogue session with them and look forward to more of such sessions.
