I was impressed by the winners of the MTSF awards, ranging from young students to senior individuals. Some have won grants for research more than once. They have grants for research and for innovation or invention for educators. I encourage everyone to look up their website for more information. I had the pleasure of meeting Ms Keisheni Ganeson from Universiti Malaysia Terengganu. She secured funding worth RM20,000 from the Toray Science Foundation, Japan for her research on smart microneedle patches combined with biosensors and feedback-induced mechanisms as a transdermal delivery system for breast cancer therapy. Aside from that, there was also another individual who did a study on gut bacteria and its association with schizophrenia.
