In our meeting with YBMK and top MOH officials in Putrajaya, we discussed solutions to the various longstanding issues affecting our contract doctors as well as the role of GPs going forward in managing the pandemic. I wish to thank YB and his team for taking the time to meet with us and I look forward to more regular engagements.

We are indeed pleased that the ministry will be renewing the contracts of all MOs in the contract system that will soon be expiring for one year. YBMK had also given the assurance that MOH will look into the proposal for longer contracts to allow for specialisation. We will be closely following up on this so do look out for more updates.

We are also pleased to note that the harmonisation of UD41 with UD43 is already in the process. MMA wishes to thank YBMK for ensuring that this longstanding issue is being resolved.


In our meeting, we also discussed vaccinations for the GPs under the National COVID-19 Immunisation Programme, private sector vaccinations, home monitoring of COVID-19 CAT 1 & 2 patients, the need for increased engagement between CDC and private sector, CKAPS as a one-stop centre, 7th Fee Schedule deregulation status and the proposal for GP pandemic partner clinics. Do look out for further updates from PPS.

Moving forward, I do hope that all GPs and their staff will soon be vaccinated as they are also frontliners in the fight against COVID-19 as we have highlighted in the media. I have been informed that there were issues in the system when submitting the names for vaccination. However, we do believe these issues are being ironed out.

As of 16 March, MMA had submitted 28,000 names consisting of doctors and staff from private healthcare. It is hoped there will be improved coordination between the state health department and the district health offices around the country.

It is understandable that there will be minor glitches along the way as this is the first time an immunisation programme on this scale is conducted in the country. MMA will ensure we play a supportive role in assisting government efforts towards the successful rollout of its programme.

In our recent EXCO meeting, we also discussed maintenance work needed for our MMA House and if we should give the building a new paintjob. Quite
