A lot of issues have ongoing engagement with the government and this is a usually continuous process being. The plan to increase our healthcare expenditure in terms of percentage of our GDP must be accelerated. This is not only for infrastructure development but also should be for the improvement of its most important asset, its healthcare personnel.

Increased on call allowances are something that recognises the work that doctors do in ensuring 24 hours care to patients in hospitals. This duty has never been a choice but a necessity and as, such entails many sacrifices by doctors. They should be appropriately acknowledged.

Hopefully the conundrum of contract doctors and permanent posts will be settled soon, but opportunities for post graduate training needs to be enhanced with doctors being given the choice to choose the pathway which is suitable for them. This has to be a win-win situation as we cannot afford to lose doctors to resignations and migration as has been the case in the last few years.

The retention of senior specialists and sub specialists is also an important issue which we will bring up, and hope that the Government will look into this urgently. These senior doctors not only provide invaluable care to patients but are also needed to teach and mentor the younger doctors. Many have been stagnating at UD56 scale for many years.

Once again I would like to thank all our members for trusting in me to lead MMA this coming term. I am grateful to have hard-working, experienced Exco and Council members to assist and guide me. We also have a very able secretariat to assist as we plan the programmes and the activities for the coming year. We all will definitely do our best to further the aims and aspirations of our doctors, MMA and healthcare in the country.
