## Sepeda Amal Borneo 2023: Reflections

Rebranded as the Sepeda Amal Borneo (Borneo Charity Cycle) from "Cycle for Cancer 2022", this is the second year of the annual charity cycling event by the Malaysian Medical Association, covering 700+km from Kuching to Bintulu. The team consisted of 20 cyclists, including 2 cancer survivors and an above knee amputee; and a team of volunteers, police, and medics.





Our beneficiary this year was the ROSE (Removing Obstacles to cErvical screening) Foundation which raises awareness through its program that features a self-sampling by women themselves to test for HPV with a secure, digital e-health platform. This approach can save lives and strives to eliminate cervical cancer among Malaysian women and you may read more about them here - <u>https://www.programrose.org</u>.

The pre-event dinner was sponsored and graced by Prof Datuk Dr Sim Kui Hian, Deputy Premier of Sarawak who gave a short speech and handed out goodie bags to each of the cyclists.

On 16<sup>th</sup> July 2023 at 8am, YB Dato' Sri Hajah Nancy Shukri, Minister of Tourism, Arts and Culture officiated the opening ceremony and flagged us off from Merdeka Palace Hotel, Kuching. A cultural dance for blessings of safety and peace was performed by the Orang Ulu just before the convoy left.

After a short 80km ride the team arrived in Serian to rest for the day. Everyone was in high spirits as it was a reunion of sorts for some, and for others the making of new friends. We had our usual dinner briefing for the next day before heading off to bed.

The next two days covered 130km to Sri Aman where Hotel Seri Simanggang had very kindly sponsored 10 rooms for our team; and another 130km to Saratok, to Rumah Dana Kerupok Sebetan (a longhouse).

We enjoyed the warm hospitality, delicious food and invigorating drinks of the Rumah Dana longhouse. The Program ROSE team had arrived before us and were conducting health talks and screening test among the women. We were also treated to a session of playing local musical instruments and trying on the cultural costumes!

Along the 140km journey to Sibu the next day, we had the pleasure of riding on a ferry twice to cross the Rajang River on the way to Sibu which was a real eye opener for many of the cyclists.

Our last two days were also 140km rides to Mukah and then to our final destination at Bintulu. We were treated to lunch at Rumah Jandang, a long house on the way to Mukah; the food, drinks and rest was a timely break in the middle of a long ride.

After six days of cycling the team finally reached Bintulu at 2pm on the 21<sup>st</sup> of July. We were welcomed by Prof Woo Yin Ling, founder of the ROSE Foundation and her team with local music, dances, and a chain of beads, symbolizing unity among all our diversity.

The event ended with a closing ceremony dinner, certificate presentation and sharing session. We had the honour hosting Dr Angela Muriuki, director of the Women's Health Programme of FIND, a non-profit organization that accelerating equitable access to reliable diagnosis globally.

Many tears were shed as the cyclists shared their experience with cancer, either in their own journey or in the lives of their loved ones. All in all, it was a very fruitful week, not so much of the distance we covered, but also the awareness created about cervical cancer and how we can eradicate it in Malaysia.
